In addition, two of our All Stars are Super All Stars, meaning that they had an average of over 23 points on two entries per competition.

New for Next Year

Better to do something imperfectly than to do nothing perfectly. ~ Robert H. Schuller

We are fast approaching the end of the season and so it is appropriate to consider what things we will do differently next year.

Under our current system, the high score is the only one that counts, thus, if a

person scores a five, a six and a nine, his or her score for the evening will be nine. If another member scores 3 nines, his or her score for the evening will also be nine. Life in the Camera Club is about to get a little more exciting. Instead of using the high score for the evening, we will be using the average

score. This means that everything counts. Under the new system if you score a 7, 8 and 10 your score for the evening will be (7+8+10)/3 = 8.33. In addition, we will allow judges to score in half points. Instead of five possible scores between 5 and 9, there will be nine.

Based on the above criteria, Alan Agdern will move up to Group AA in Black and White and Color Prints. Marty will still be the lone competitor in projection at least for now. As part of our new criteria, the person with the highest score above or equal to 8.5 average with a minimum of 6 competitions entered, will be promoted to Group AA (Salon). If fewer than 18 images are submitted there will be an adjustment applied to the average. These are difficult criteria to meet, but that's the idea.

Thinking about a 50mm?

With the excellent choices available in zoom lenses, there has been little demand for single focal length (prime) lenses in the last few years. However there seems to be a new trend in favor of old fashioned 50 mm lenses. Perhaps it's due to nostalgia, the desire to reduce weight or the challenge of confining yourself to a single field of view. These lenses come most commonly in one of two maximum apertures, 1.8 and 1.4. The 1.4 is generally about twice as expensive as the 1.8. Does that mean its better? Not so! In terms of edge to edge sharpness, lack of vignetting and chromatic aberrations, the f1.8 is almost always better. The f1.4 when used at f1.4 will of course allow a shallower depth of field. That could be a major advantage, and If that's your aim, go for it! If it's not worth significantly more money to you, stick with the 1.8.

Year- End Competition

The End of Year competition will be on May 26. You may enter up to <u>6 images</u> in each category from those that have scored 7 points or more during the current season. This means that you could have as many as 18 entries.

The best image in each category and class will be selected for a "Sarah and Clem Kleinmann Award"- our highest honor. There will be 2 runner-ups (1st Runner Up and 2nd Runner Up) in each category and class. No member can receive more than one award in each category or class.

An initial elimination round will be used until there is between 3 and 8 entries are left for numerical scoring. Three judges will score each image from 5 to 9 points, without comment, for a total of 15 to 27 points.

The High Average Award winner of both the black & White and Color Group A categories was Alan Agdern.

Alan scored 58 points in Black & White and 56 points in Color. and since he did it with a better than 8.50 average of all scores in his best 6 contests, he will be

promoted to group AA as of September.
